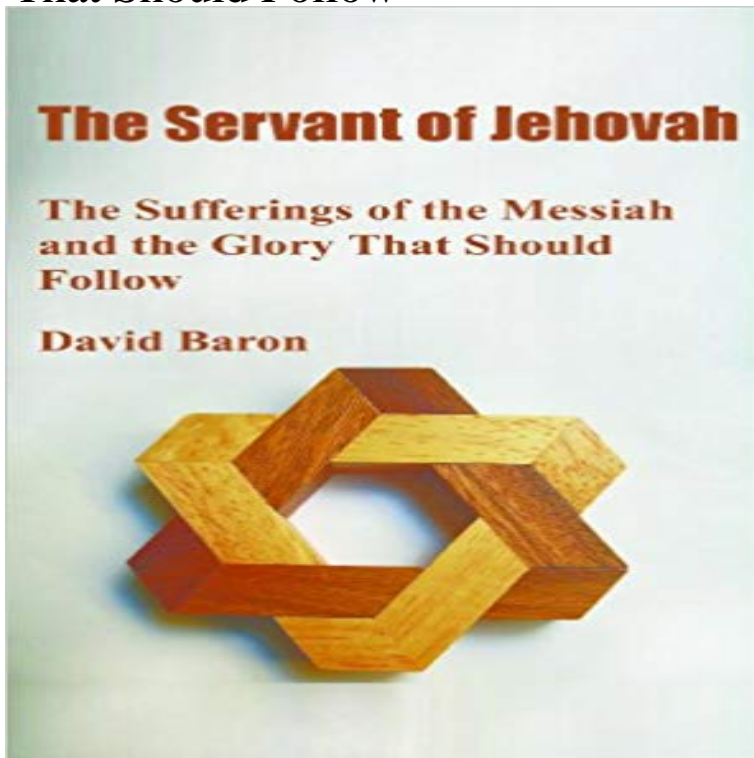


# The Servant of Jehovah: The Sufferings of the Messiah and the Glory That Should Follow
