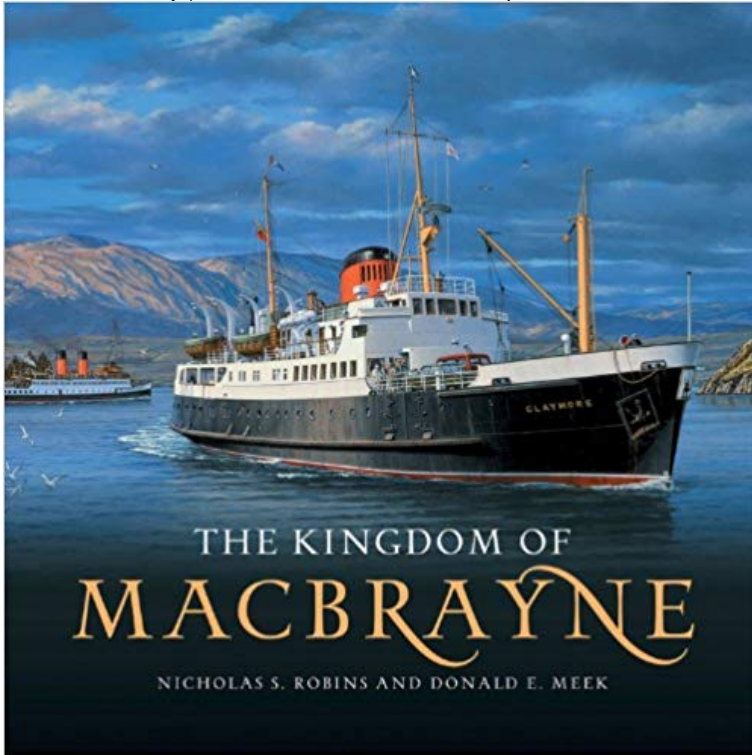


The Kingdom of MacBrayne
