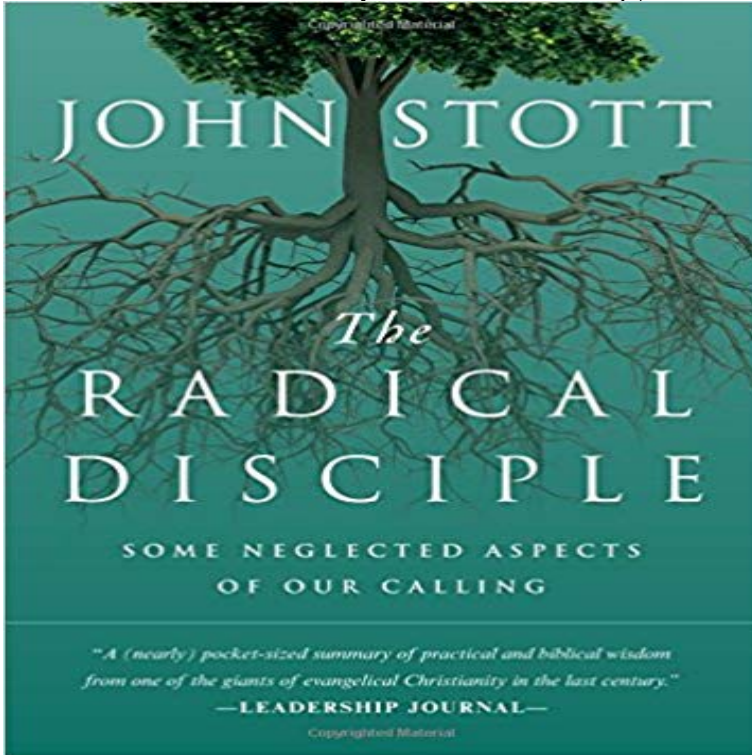


# The Radical Disciple: Some Neglected Aspects of Our Calling
