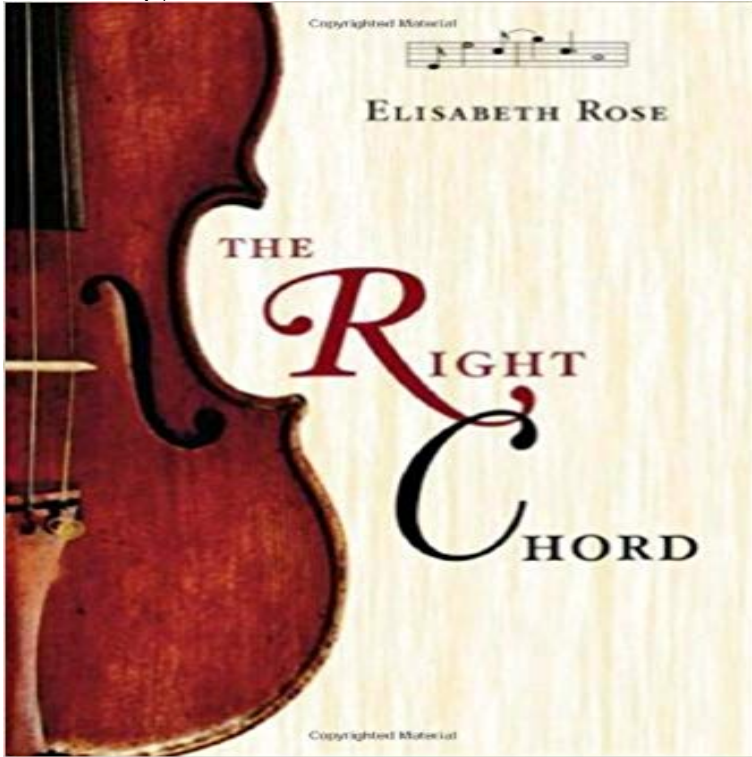


# The Right Chord
